INTRODUCTION

There is growing recognition of the importance of evidence, particularly evidence from evaluations, in national decision-making and the crucial role of parliamentarians and their support staff in ensuring that evidence-based approaches are used for strengthening oversight, budgeting resource appropriation, legislation, and policymaking across all sectors.

The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) is particularly interested in how the use of evidence impacts on sectors related to agriculture. It is important to emphasize that given the nature of parliamentary business, parliamentarians deal with various subjects/issues while carrying out their legislative functions, the use of evidence cuts across all sectors of their work. As such, rather than a sectoral focus, there will be an effort to equip parliamentarians with the right tools that can facilitate the use of evidence in their legislative duties.

Parliamentarians and their staff need data and evidence to make decisions that effectively, equitably, and justly allocate resources and meet people's social and economic needs.

However, they face major technical and political challenges related to the generation and the use of evidence to inform policies.

This challenge is acute in Africa given the dearth of information and analysis about the conditions, problems, and solutions of social and economic development. Parliaments in Africa lack the capacity to compile and use evidence in the design, oversight, and evaluation of legislation and policies on the critical economic and social issues facing various countries on the continent.

Better use of evidence by Parliamentarians, and associated research and policy making bodies will facilitate better development outcomes, and more transparent and efficient governance.

Key components of evidence-based policy making include making decisions based on the best available evidence, evidence from monitoring, evaluation, and research; using data and information systems systematically; applying policy-making

frameworks; engaging the citizenry in decision making; conducting a sound evaluation on the effectiveness of laws, legislations, and policies, and disseminating what is learned to further inform future policies, legislations, and laws.

While there is some existing data pointing to the capacity gaps of African parliamentarians in using evidence in legislation and policies, including their M&E and data use skills needs, there is no comprehensive or detailed assessment of their specific challenges and needs or whether and how they currently access and use evidence in legislative drafting, policy formulation, and oversight.

The Assessment, Analysis, and Development of Tools to Strengthen the Use of Evidence in Policies and Legislation in Africa (TSUE) project seeks to improve access to evidence used by parliamentarians and policy makers in their legislative and policy making work. The activity does not seek to evaluate parliaments and parliamentarians. Rather, it is about helping elected representatives use data and evidence from evaluation and other sources, to make informed decisions. To this end, knowledge of organisations and institutions already working on evidence-based policymaking and strengthening capacity of Parliamentarians on access and use of evidence is very critical to improve the use of evidence in Parliament. This document contains a mapping of some organizations working in this space in Africa. It is intended to support Parliamentarians, staff of Parliamentarians, think tanks and other organisations working on evidence-based policy-making on potential organisations they can collaborate with or source for evidence or research materials that can be used to support legislative and policy-making functions.
